Third District Volunteer Fire Company Station 14 From the Office of the Chief It is with profound sadness that the 3DVFC announces the Line of Duty Death of Life member, Past Chief and Fire Police Captain, Ed Margavich, who, today, succumbed to his injuries sustained during the performance of his duties while operating on Box 11-36 on August 8th in Croydon.

Ed joined our organization in 1960. He was known for his kindness, wisdom, and the infectious laughter that brightened our meetings. His spirit will be missed by all.

A memorial has been placed in front of Station 14 in honor of Chief Margavich, and may be visited by the community at any time.



Fire Police Officer Daniel Raymond Angert, 44 Petrolia Volunteer Fire Company. Petrolia, Pennsylvania On August 24, 2005, Fire Police Officer Angert and the members of his fire department responded to a structural fire. Fire Police Officer Angert blocked an approach to the fire scene and controlled traffic. The traffic pattern in front of the fire-involved structure was 1-way in order to facilitate a tanker shuttle. At approximately 1300hrs, Fire Police Officer Angert notified the fire police commander that he had been run over by a car. Fire Police Officer Angert had momentarily turned away from traffic. When he looked back, a car was upon him, and it ran over Fire Police Officer Angert's foot and ankle. He was also suffering from chest pains. Fire Police Officer Angert was transported to the hospital to have his injury evaluated. He was released from the hospital later in the day and told to stay off hbis foot and to see his personal physician. The following morning, on August 25th, an ambulance was called to Fire Police Officer Angert's home. He had suffered a heart attack. Bystander CPR was in progress when responders arrived. Fire Police Officer Angert was transported to the hospital but did not survive.

Bills that have moved in the 2025-2026

PA. Legislative session

SB 90 Senator Doug Mastriano- modifies the testing requirements for entry level fire and emergency services training - into law as act 33 of 2025.

SB 398 Senator Michelle Brooks - allows the fire company that has a valid small game of chance license to conduct online raffles - passed finally in the senate and referred to the house gaming oversight committee.

SB 466 Senator Michelle Brooks - requires grant reporting, provides for fire suppression training credits and codifies provisions related to the fire and EMS company grant program. Signed into law as Act 25 Of 2025.

Bills introduced so far with no legislative action in the 2025 - 2026 legislative session

SB-923 Exempts Volunteer Fire and EMS companies from the right to no law.

HB-1756 - allows volunteer fire companies, nonprofit rescue squads, nonprofit ambulance services, and nonprofit older adult centers to be charged a residential rate for all Public Utilities.

PA State Fire Academy

Have you set up your account on the Acadis portal yet? Everyone in, the fire service needs to. This is used for your training through the state. But also, the Fire Commissioner needs to know how many volunteers are in the state so he can help get funds and other services for us.

Bills introduced so far with no legislative action in the 2025 - 2026 legislative session

HB- 1757 - establishes a voluntary firefighter cancer registry within the Department of Health.

HB-1758- in order for a firefighters workers compensation claim related to cancer to be denied there would have to be a clear and convincing medical evidence that the cancer was not caused by firefighting and the evidence that firefighting in no way contributed to the cancer.

HB – **1761**- prohibits Public Utilities and municipal owned water systems from charging standby fees when Volunteer Fire companies, nonprofit rescue squads, and ambulance services have sprinklers.

HB - 1817 — creates a 25-foot safety zone around first responders while they are performing their duties in certain situations.
